From the Superintendent ~

Can you believe we've already made it through the first quarter of the 2024-2025 school year and we're almost to the end of the first semester? Time is flying by, and I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has contributed to making the start of the year so successful.

The first nine weeks have been both busy and productive across the district. Literacy continues to be a top priority, and we've made significant changes to our curriculum to enhance students' reading and writing skills. Our focus now is on carrying these improvements consistently through each grade level. Recently, we completed our benchmarking assessments to understand where students are as they begin the year. This data will help us track their growth as the year progresses.

Safety remains a cornerstone of our work. At the start of every school year, all buildings are required to conduct fire and lockdown drills. In addition to these standard practices, we are planning a district-wide evacuation drill in March to review and refine our procedures. We are committed to creating a safe environment for every student. Please remember: If you see something or hear something concerning, report it to a trusted staff member. Safety is a shared responsibility.

Attendance has been excellent so far this year - thank you! Parents and students, your commitment to being present is so appreciated. To ensure this positive trend continues, the district will maintain attendance monitoring at all levels. If you ever need assistance to help your child attend school regularly, please contact your building office. Our goal is to support families in every way possible. As fall gives way to winter, now is the time to prepare for snow and ice season. If you haven't already, please sign up for the One Call alert system. This is the fastest way to receive notifications about school closures or emergencies. Additionally, updates will be posted on our website and shared via local TV and radio stations. If your contact information (address or phone number) has changed, please notify your building secretary so we can update our records promptly.

As we near the end of the second quarter, we remain focused on our mission: *facilitating maximum learning for every student*. This work would not be possible without the strong partnership we share with our students, staff, and community. Thank you for trusting us with your children's education and for your continued support.

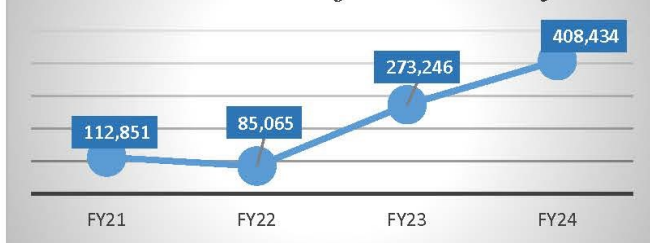

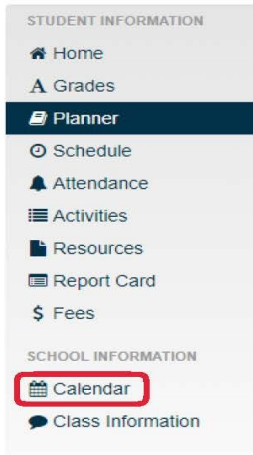


Calendar Feature in ProgressBook

Calendar setting preferences will need to be set for events, classes, and schools.

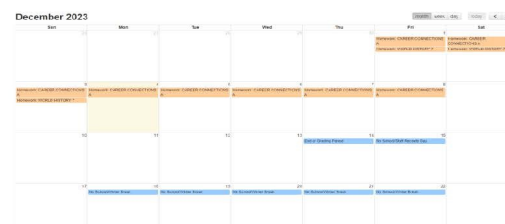

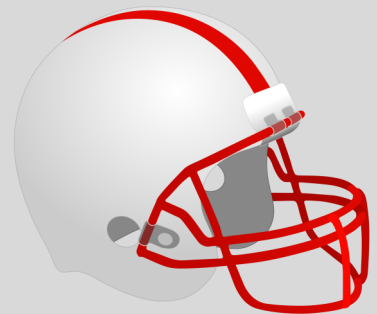
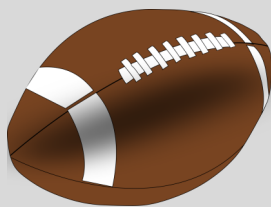

7th Graders

- In world history students are currently studying Ancient Greece.
- ELA students just finished completing their first argumentative essays of the year. This is a type of writing that is practiced throughout the year and appears on the state test in April. The month of December students will be reading a variety of different Greek myths. This connects to the information about the Greeks they have been learning in World History and leads to reading the novel The Lightning Thief after winter break. Students will also be completing a Body Biography Project by researching a god or goddess and presenting the research on a poster.
- In science students are studying all things energy; sound waves, light waves, heat waves, and more!

8th Graders

- The 8th grade students have been studying colonization in history. Each student drew a map of the 13 colonies.
- In science students have been learning about waves and glaciers. They must create a power point on erosion and glacier erosion.
- Art students are learning about the book of Kells and decorating ceiling tiles.
- Language arts students just finished reading "The Outsiders" novel and had a Greasers vs Soc dress up day. Language Arts classes start argumentative writing and reading "Long Way Down" between Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Redskin Rewards

Utica High School is continuing to recognize students for meeting specific criteria for each 9-week grading period. The system has changed to a point reward system. This system allows students the opportunity to accumulate points and cash those points in for various items. This system has taken the place of the red/grey card reward system.

- 3.0 GPA = 20 points

- 0 Absences (excluding medical) = 25 points
- 0 Tardies to Class/School = 20 points
