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From the Superintendent ~

Can you believe we've already made it through the first quarter of the 2024-2025 school year and we're almost to the end of the first semester? Time is flying by, and I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has contributed to making the start of the year so successful.

Literacy continues to be a top priority, and we've made significant changes to our curriculum to enhance students' reading and writing skills. 


They spoke to students in grades K, 1, and 2 about fire safety. Do you have a safety plan in place for home?

7th Graders
