I wanted to start this newsletter by saying **THANK YOU**. It is not often parents hear someone say thanks for all they do as a parent. 

Utica Wrestling



Money Talks ~ Mrs. Kellie Breehl, Treasurer

This is a very busy time as we navigate past the mid-way point of the 2022-2023 school year and as the calendar year 2022 concludes. The district is currently amidst the 2021-2022 State Audit, all 1099 and W-2s have been processed and distributed, and now we are beginning the 2023-2024 budgeting procedures.

For operations, school districts in Ohio rely heavily on state funding. Our district is funded 50.2% from state sources and 49.8% from local resources. Every two years the Governor releases his biennial budget proposal. The new biennial budget proposal, released this week, will include the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 school years. Once the bill is reviewed and simulations become available, webinars will be provided to discuss an overview of the proposal. The proposal will continue the phase-in of the Fair School Funding Plan, which will provide funding for the third and fourth years of the six-year implementation.



Our office would like to congratulate Mr. Caleb Hickman and the FFA classes on their recognitions: Logan Scarberry, Utica FFA Treasurer, received a gold rating on his treasurer's book. Melinda Wesley, Utica FFA Reporter, received a gold rating on her reporter's book. Audrey Boeshart, Utica FFA Secretary, received a gold rating on her secretary's book. These students will be recognized at the Ohio FFA State Convention in May.

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
