# 1. TRUSTWORTHY

- does own work - truthful sincere

- willing to admit mistakes - honest - forthright

- dependable - ethical

## 2. RESPONSIBLE

- doesn't make excuses - good attendance/punctual - makes good decisions - takes care of school property - learns from mistakes - takes care of belongings - accepts consequences for actions - puts forth best effort - obeys school/class rules

# 5. SELF-DISCIPLINED

- sets/achieves goals - works independently - organized - thinks before acting and speaking - self-motivated - persistent - takes charge of self - strong work ethic - uses time wisely - self-controlled - completes tasks - pushes self beyond minimum

#### 6. POSITIVE

- optimistic - displays positive self-esteem - enthusiastic - open-minded - confident - cheerful

- voices concerns in an appropriate way

#### 7. GOOD ROLE MODEL

- decisive - courageous - respected by peers - deals effectively with peer pressure - encourages others - shows initiative - strives to communicate effectively - independent

# 8. RESOURCEFUL

- acquires info in a variety of ways - good problem-solver - creative - critical thinker - able to improvise - adaptable - practical - seeks help when needed

# 9. WELL-MANNERED

- uses appropriate language - courteous/polite

- says "please", "thank-you", "you're welcome", and "excuse me" - greets/acknowledges others

- displays proper audience etiquette - allows others to speak without interrupting

- demonstrates proper table manners - shakes hands/makes eye contact when meeting others

- walks around two people speaking - listens to public address announcements

- picks up after oneself

- introduces others to someone who doesn't know them

- removes hat in public buildings, during the Pledge of Allegiance, National Anthem, and Alma Mater

- demonstrates common courtesies to others (e.g. opens doors, helps carry packages, etc.)

#### 10. GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP

- displays school spirit in positive ways - cheer, not jeer, in victory/defeat

- treats visitors with respect and dignity - shows respect to opponents/fans
