WHEREAS, the Board of Education now desires to sell the Board property at private sale pursuant to R.C. '3313.41(B).

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has received a written Purchase Agreement from the Utica Volunteer Fire Department and Utica Emergency Squad, which is on file at the Board of Education's office located at 312 Maple Avenue, Utica, Ohio 43080, and which sets forth in detail the terms and conditions of the sale of the aforementioned Board property.

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Education shall sell the Board property which has been previously identified herein in a private sale pursuant to R.C. '3313.41(B).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board President and Treasurer is authorized to execute the aforementioned Purchase Agreement with the Utica Volunteer Fire Department and Utica Emergency Squad and to execute all other written instruments and documentation necessary to complete the sale of the Board property.
