Can you believe we have already made it through the first quarter of the 2021-2022 school year? I would like to express my many thanks to all who have made the start of the year so successful. As we continue into the second quarter, we are focusing on our mission to facilitate maximum learning for every student. The District could not achieve improvement without the strong partnership we share with our students, staff, and community. I want to thank each of you for doing your part to live our mission.

The District has had a busy and productive nine weeks. We continue to focus on our Four Pillars of Success, which you can check out on our webpage under the academic link. As we keep the school year and the upcoming activities in mind, we want to continue to stress our desire to provide a safe environment for all of our students. Earlier this month we completed our required safety drill. I can say that our goal continues to ensure everyone knows what to do in the event of an emergency. We are constantly monitoring the COVID issue and reviewing the data from the Licking County Health Department. With your help we will remain in school, face to face. Remember safety is everyone's concern; if you see something or hear anything please let someone know.

We are staying focused on reading and math as improvement goals. With the help of COVID money we received, we were able to add reading tutors and a math coach at the elementary level. Our staff has been looking at data to pinpoint student strengths and weaknesses so that necessary adjustments in teaching and learning can be made. With our continued review of the curriculum, you will be able to see that the quality of education in our district continues to move forward.

As fall starts to end, the snow and ice of winter will be beginning. The quickest way to be notified of school closings or emergencies is through the One Call system. We will also use the local television and radio stations. Emergency information will also be posted to our webpage. If you have made a change in your address or telephone numbers please notify the building secretaries so these can be updated in our systems. This helps the district to provide information to you quickly.

Treasurer's Office News



Did you know...

- ⇒ North Fork Local Schools was awarded the Ohio Auditor of State Award for the 2019-2020 school year for excellence in financial reporting in accordance with General Accepted Accounting Principals (GAAP) and compliance with applicable laws.
- ⇒ Gwen Crain and Stacey Hale are new to the Treasurer's Office this year. Gwen manages the Accounts Payables/Receivables Department and Stacey manages the Payroll Department.
- ⇒ The state approved HB110, referred to as the Fair School Funding Plan. The actual release has been delayed until December 2021. The new formula will introduce many changes to how state funding is calculated. The new calculation will be referenced and applied to the November 2021 5 Year Forecast. The forecast can be viewed on the North Fork website at www.northfork.k12.oh.us/Treasurer.
- ⇒ Our district was awarded \$2,253,816.58 through the American Rescue Plan for Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER III). 20% of these funds or \$450,763.32, must be spent on academic loss. You can view the district plan on the North Fork website www.northfork.k12.oh.us.
- ⇒ In fiscal year 2020-2021 the district's revenue source was 48% state funded and 52% local funded.

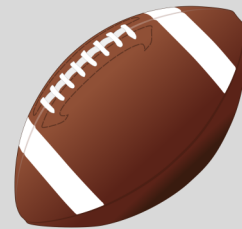

Curriculum Corner

21st century learning - What does that mean and how is that different from education in year's past?

Curriculum decisions are generated from the U.S. Department of Education based on global changes in our economy and how we can best prepare our students for post-secondary training or work force skills. Three-quarters of the fastest growing occupations require education beyond a high school diploma- science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) careers.

As a district, we align our curriculum to Ohio's Learning Standards that address 21st century learning skills and prepare our students to become productive citizens. Standards based curriculum align to the state's model curriculum decisions and are often not directed by local decisions. As we continue to move forward in a technology-innovated work force, here are a few of the major key changes to curriculum and 21st century education.

- Respond to the economical, technological, and societal shifts that are happening at an ever-increasing pace.
- Set children up to succeed in a world where more than half of the jobs they'll have over their careers don't even exist yet.
- Provide students with the skills and competencies they need to thrive in the 21st century through creativity, collaboration, critical thinking and communication.

One of the biggest changes in education platforms is the shift from the traditional classroom environment. There are more opportunities for collaboration among students, which leads to more engagement. Technology has increased in the classrooms through the use of I-pads and students are adapting and adjusting to changes in the delivery of instruction.

Big Brothers Big Sisters

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Licking & Perry Counties has come to North Fork! BBBSLP is offering two different programs in the district: Lunch Buddies and After School Buddies.

Lunch Buddies is a one-to-one mentoring program at Utica Elementary School where community volunteers and Utica High School students are matched with an elementary student. Volunteers eat lunch with the elementary students, assist with school work, and play games while building a positive friendship. This program takes place every Wednesday throughout the academic school year for approximately 40 minutes during the student's lunch and recess time.

After School Buddies is a one-to-one mentoring program at Newton Elementary School where community volunteers, Denison University students, and Utica High School students are matched with an elementary student. Volunteers share a snack, assist with homework, and play games with an elementary student. This program takes place every Wednesday throughout the academic school year for approximately 90 minutes after school.

The meetings only take place on school grounds. Big Brothers Big Sisters' professional staff oversees all interaction between children and mentors to ensure child safety and coach mentoring matches through difficult situations.

Research shows that BBBS's one-to-one mentoring programs have tangible outcomes for children. One-on-one attention from a caring role model is crucial for developing self-confidence, and research shows that Bigs help Littles feel more confident in several areas. Evidence shows that being matched through Big Brothers Big Sisters can make a big difference in how a child performs in school and how they feel about school in general.

We are witnessing the greatness these programs offer the North Fork high school and elementary students!

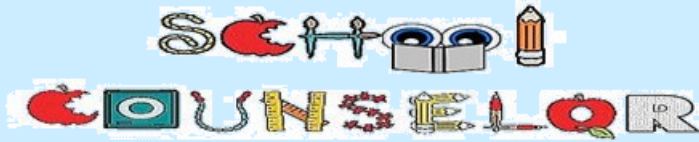
