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Course description: Spanish III is an intermediate Spanish course that allows the student to explore the language in all four modes of communication, including reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Cultural topics will be introduced as well. The student will learn to build on the skills they have already learned to further improve their proficiency in Spanish. During this class, we will focus on developing the students' ability to read, write, speak, and listen in Spanish. There will be a midterm exam and a final exam in this course. By the end of Spanish III, students should reach Intermediate Low proficiency. This means that students should be able to use multiple grammatical tenses to convey their message in paragraph form.

Classroom rules:

- 1. Be respectful of the teacher and of other students
- 2. Be prepared to learn everyday
- 3. Ask for help when you need it

Classroom Policies

Absent Policy: If a student has an excused absence from school, they will have as many days to make up the work as days they were absent. It is the student's responsibility to ask the teacher for the work they missed while they were absent. Any papers that were passed out during class will be in the absent work organizer under the column "Spanish III".

Late Work Policy: Classwork will only be accepted up to one day after it is due. If an assignment is submitted within one day after the due date, the student will lose 50% off of their grade. After one day, the assignment cannot be submitted for credit.

Electronics Policy: Cell phones should not be used during instructional time. Headphones should not be in any ears during instructional time.

The students will be responsible for studying the vocabulary list outside of class. The students will take a vocabulary quiz during each unit. Some units may include other assessments such as speaking tests, listening tests, reading tests, and writing tests. The students will need to know the vocabulary words in order to perform well on quizzes and tests. The dates of tests and quizzes will be announced in advance. Students should use Quizlet to study. During this course, your student will explore a variety of topics in Spanish, including:

- Reading Skills in Spanish
- Childhood Activities in Spanish

At the beginning of each unit, the students will receive a list of all of the vocabulary words that they will be expected to know. We will use class time to study the words on the vocabulary lists through a variety of different activities such as worksheets, games, skits, videos, and songs. Students will also need to spend time outside of class studying vocabulary words, so that they can be prepared for the quizzes and tests in this class. Some units will be longer than others, so some vocabulary lists will be longer than others. Students should use Quizlet to study. I have created Quizlet lists for each unit in this course. I will use Progress Book to enter your student's grades, so I encourage you to check Progress Book regularly to monitor your student's progress in Spanish this quarter.
